Dear brothers and sisters,

I would like to begin my letter by offering my heartfelt thanks to all for any help you have given over the past few months. Whether praying in your homes, offering financial support, or giving up your time to volunteer for us, your help has been invaluable seeing us through a busy period. I am always immensely impressed with the willingness to serve and by all the hard work that so many put into our parish. It is, as such, only right that I should start my letter by thanking you all, as we once more look back over the past few weeks and celebrate what has worked well, even as we look forward to the challenges ahead.

The past few weeks have been a busy time for All Saints' Church yet there is one thing in particular that I would like to mention to you in this letter. A few weeks ago we saw our parish youth group lead one of the services in our church for the first time. Many of these young people have only started coming to church through our youth group and have started to become actively involved in the life of our church. They led the service in worship, prayer, and even gave a short talk based on the bible passage.

As I have since pondered this service I have been reminded that God grows his church in whatever way he deems right. When we take part in mission we do so by recognising that God's plan is different from our plans. It is, after all, God's mission we take part in. This minded me that we should have hope, that we should be encouraged that although we may worry about various matters in our church nationally - declining numbers, finances, etc - it is ultimately God's church, God's mission and plan, so we should not be afraid. Seeing those young people be brave and lead reminded me that God will work with whatever he has to grow his church.

As we see the youth group step in to taking part in God's mission, we should open our arms and embrace the way that God seems to be moving in our parish, supporting it in whatever way we can. I know from my own experience that this is certainly something that many of you have been excellent at, and have felt the support of the whole parish as we continue to try to engage all people, young and old. So my message to you is both one of thanks and also a reminder of the hope that it is God's mission, and he never fails; a simple message yet one which we must regularly be reminded of.

Thus, as we turn our eyes to the weeks and months ahead, there are many exciting things approaching us. At All Saints' we have mass baptisms planned and, at St George's, many exciting events related to the bi-centennial. There is much to hope in the months ahead and much to be grateful for too. So keep on spreading the gospel in hope and faith, wherever you are, pray for God's mission in this parish and know that he is at work here.

Parish of Chorley St. George and All Saints New Church Electoral Roll Spring 2025

Background

In accordance with Church Representation Rules, every six years each Parish of the Church of England has to compile a new electoral roll and as the existing roll was compiled in 2019, we have to create a brand new electoral roll in 2025.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q. Who does this apply to?

A: Everyone! Everyone will be removed from the current roll and must re-apply.

Q: But my name is already on the electoral roll for public elections.

A: The church electoral roll is totally separate to the electoral roll known as the Electoral register for UK elections and is used to enable you to vote at our Annual Church Meeting and to hold certain positions such as sidesperson, or to be part of the Parochial Church Council (PCC), which is responsible for local church affairs.

Q: So who can apply to go on the new roll?

A: Under the Church Representation Rules you are entitled to have your name entered on the roll, if you:

(i) are baptised and aged 16 or over; and

- (ii) have signed a form of application for enrolment; and either
- iii) are members of the Church of England or of any Church in

communion with the Church of England being resident in the parish or (not being resident in the parish) having habitually attended public worship in the parish during the six months prior to the application for enrolment; Or

(iv) are members in good standing of a Church (not in communion with the Church of England) which subscribes to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity declaring themselves to be also members of the Church of England and having habitually attended public worship in the parish church of England being resident in the parish during the period of six months prior to enrolment.

Important dates

A formal legal notice will be displayed in both churches on the 1st March and forms will be available from this date.

The New Electoral Roll forms will be accepted from the 2nd March to the 19th April and the Visiting team will liaise with the 'housebound' between these dates.

The New Roll will be displayed on internal notice boards of each church on the 3^{rd} May. The New Roll will be confirmed at the APCM on the 20^{th} May.


The History Page February 2025 Two Hundred Years Ago

Recent issues have dealt with reasons why St George's waited, empty as the Marie Celeste, between the summers of 1824 and 1825. The architect, Thomas Rickman, did not forget his large creation during this time. There must have been a watchman designated to keep an eye on the building, for as yet no locks were fitted.

In addition, Rickman called by several times. In the Spring of 1825 he noted that, "Chorley (i.e. St George's) looked very well". He evidently had some pride in his building. Living in Birmingham, he

would pass the chapel quite frequently during coach runs to his commissions in Preston and further north. He developed a liking for the then new Yarrow Bridge Hotel, now positioned, as it is today, at the foot of the Wigan and South Yarrow Turnpike in Duxbury. Once he recorded that he simply took breakfast there, it very likely being a posting stage in 1825.

Annual Parish Meeting (APM) and Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM)

Our APM and APCM will be held on 20th May 2025 at All Saints' Primary School, Moor Road, Chorley, starting at 7:30pm. The APM (normally a very short meeting) will be held first followed by APCM. Both the meetings are major events in the parochial calendar and are conducted in accordance with the requirements as laid out in the Church Representation Rules.

The primary purpose of the APM is to elect the Churchwardens for the parish, in our case we need to elect a total of four, two for each of our parish churches. In addition to those listed on the Church Electoral Roll (referred to as the 'Roll') of the parish, those persons resident in the parish whose names are entered on a register of local government electors by reason of such residence may also attend this meeting.

The purpose of the APCM is to receive reports on changes to the 'Roll', general parish activities and financial matters. Due to 2025 being the year that a new 'Roll' is required to be prepared, the APCM will receive the newly prepared 'Roll'. The APCM also elects new members to the PCC, and also to Deanery Synod every three years. As elections for Deanery Synod were held in 2023, the next elections will be held in 2026. Only persons whose names are listed on the 'Roll' may attend this meeting.

Members of the clergy (including retired clergy) are not legally permitted to have their names listed on a Church Electoral Roll. They are, however, permitted to attend both these meetings.
