Dear brothers and sisters,

Alleluia! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed. Alleluia!

Whilst by the time this reaches you Easter may have come and gone, I am writing this during Holy Week of 2025. I have been reminded of many things this Lent but most of all I have been minded of the hope that comes through us, his Easter people. Whether in the depths of winter, the soul searching of Lent or the warmth of Spring, we are always the Easter people on earth. Indeed, I have seen something of that hope in you all these past weeks and months. What joy it is to greet you this Eastertide, as we once again proclaim the great hope of our faith: that love is stronger than death, and that in Christ, we are given new life.

In the stillness of Holy Saturday, we waited. In the shadows of Good Friday, we wept. But on Easter morning, the tomb was found empty and the world was changed forever. This is not just a story from long ago, but a living reality that continues to unfold in our midst. Wherever there is forgiveness, reconciliation, and courage in the face of despair, the Risen Christ walks among us.

As your curate, I have been moved again and again by the quiet faithfulness of our community: the unseen acts of kindness, the prayers whispered for others, the generous hands that serve without fanfare. This, too, is resurrection. This is life breaking through where we least expect it.

It is true that, as we look to the months ahead, at the looming interregnum, we may well be apprehensive and filled with uncertainty, if we did not remember the Easter life that we live. There is always hope and newness in our God, who works through our hope and faith to do great things. Just as, on Holy Saturday, the first disciples sat in silent despair and worry, so too may we currently be unsure. Yet the joy and light of Easter dispels the darkness of our fear and brings us into the warmth of God's love.

Let us carry the light of Easter into the weeks and months ahead. Whether we feel full of joy or still burdened by sorrow, let us walk together as people of the Resurrection—people who dare to hope, to love, and to believe in the promise of new beginnings. I know many of you already live out such hope and faith, that although the future may seem uncertain, we may know that – when that time comes – we shall step up to the challenge ahead with God in our heart.

May the Risen Christ bring peace to your hearts, joy to your homes, and hope to all you meet.

Annual Parish Meeting (APM) and Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM)

Our APM and APCM will be held on 20th May 2025 at All Saints' Primary School, Moor Road, Chorley, starting at 7:30pm. The APM (normally a very short meeting) will be held first followed by APCM. Both the meetings are major events in the parochial calendar and are conducted in accordance with the requirements as laid out in the Church Representation Rules.

The primary purpose of the APM is to elect the Churchwardens for the parish, in our case we need to elect a total of four, two for each of our parish churches. In addition to those listed on the Church Electoral Roll (referred to as the 'Roll') of the parish, those persons resident in the parish whose names are entered on a register of local government electors by reason of such residence may also attend this meeting.

The purpose of the APCM is to receive reports on changes to the 'Roll', general parish activities and financial matters. Due to 2025 being the year that a new 'Roll' is required to be prepared, the APCM will receive the newly prepared 'Roll'. The APCM also elects new members to the PCC, and also to Deanery Synod every three years. As elections for Deanery Synod were held in 2023, the next elections will be held in 2026. Only persons whose names are listed on the 'Roll' may attend this meeting.

Members of the clergy (including retired clergy) are not legally permitted to have their names listed on a Church Electoral Roll. They are, however, permitted to attend both these meetings.

Spotlight on Safeguarding

Regularly update software, be aware of phishing attempts, and be mindful of the people you connect with online.

Strong Passwords: Use a mix of upper and lowercase letters, numbers, and symbols for all your accounts.

Unique Passwords: Avoid reusing the same password across multiple accounts.

The History Page April 2025 Two Hundred Years Ago

As the Spring of 1825 turned to Summer, Thomas Rickman, the architect of the new chapel of St George's, Chorley, dealt with the few matters that remained in delivering the project. He saw to it that the contractors were all paid. The two chiefs were understandably mason George Miller, who received £6203 and carpenter William Rich, who took away £2796. Rich's last task was to ensure the locks were correctly fitted. He complained to Rickman that the workmen tasked with this were of poor quality but all seemed eventually satisfactory. Presumably a watchman had been employed prior to the locks being applied to the door.

Rickman still called regularly at Chorley and sometimes showed steely determination. On 12th June, he left Blackburn by chaise, only for the transport to lose a wheel near Hoghton. The rotund architect simply loaded a hired man with his instruments and plans, before taking a long walk by the canal towpath until descending to St George's. There he met with Oliver Cooper and Robert Morley Master, curates of the mother church of St Laurence's who were preparing to take charge of the welcome chapel of ease.


